Buckthorn Removal Project Event at Tower Hill Park

The Prospect Park Garden Club and PPA's Tower Hill and Environment Committees, in cooperation with the Surly Gives-a-Damn volunteers, would like to invite folks to take part in another BUCKTHORN CLEAN-UP day at Tower Hill Park. This is part of a projected 3-year project to eradicate buckthorn from Tower Hill and to replace it with native perennials, shrubs and trees.

Date: Saturday, June 28, 10 to noon, rain or shine (bring rain poncho, hat, just in case of wetness)

We are very pleased to have on board for this buckthorn clean-up the Surly Givesa-Damn volunteer group, from our neighbor Surly Brewing Co. They have previous experience eliminating buckthorn, so are a welcome addition to our project.

We will be applying current practices of buckthorn removal, called the Critical Period Cutting Method, which has been successfully applied in recent years around the city. No chemicals are applied. This tactic basically starves the buckthorn over the course of 2-3 years of regular cutting and tending.

No previous experience is necessary. We will show you on-the-spot what kind of cuts to make to the plants.

This is a great opportunity for folks of all ages to participate - children, young folks, students, retirees - anyone who cares about Tower Hill Park and wants to seize this opportunity to make it a more beautiful place and rid ourselves of the scourge of buckthorn from Tower Hill once and for all!

Please bring tools and equipment if you can! Some tools will be provided, but you can bring your own loppers, clippers, tarps for hauling, small pruning saws, rakes, brooms, etc. No power tools are allowed. And do wear strong GLOVES, eye protection, and durable clothing to prevent scratches from the thorns on the plants.
